RCM Report to Area

August 2015

The last RSC met in Evansville July 19th, 2015. I was a little late for the meeting but was counted as present and was able to participate in all business matters. Pennyriple and South Central Kentucky Areas were not present.

Since the Areas did not receive the May Regional minutes until July 18th, Owensboro Area made a motion to table the KRCNA 29 motions in order for the RCM's to return the motions to their areas. Louisville area seconded the motion. OVANA, Owensboro and Louisville voted yes. Across the Rivers Area abstained. Motion passed 3-1-0

I have turned in the 5 motions from KRCNA 29 to be included in August's new business so they can be voted on by the Louisville Area.

Attached to my report is the final KRCNA 29 Convention Committee Report and the July KRSCNA Treasurer's Report. The region's balance at the beginning of the July meeting was \$18,395.57.

I brought up Louisville Area's concern over the regional financial policy and it was discussed at length. I made a motion to form an ad hoc committee to review the policy and bring back recommendations to the RSC. Owensboro seconded the motion and all areas agreed. The ad hoc committee will be chaired by Region Vice-Chair Frank H. and will meet after the next RSC.

I attended the Southern Zonal Forum July 25th in Lexington and participated in three workshops. All NA members were invited to attend and participate. Four other members from the Louisville Area also participated in this event.

The Pennyriple Area will be hosting the 29th annual Freedom Between the Lakes campout at Energy Lake Sept 18-20th

The next RSC will be September 20th at the Energy Lake Campground

KRCNA XXIX Convention Committee Report

May 17, 2015

Hello Family,

I want to thank you all for allowing me the opportunity to serve as chair for the KRCNA XXIX Convention. Overall I believe that the convention was successful as it met our primary goal which was to provide addicts with an opportunity to celebrate their recovery and to generate operating income for the Kentuckiana Region.

The final KRCNA 29 committee meeting was held on 4/18/15 at The Floyd County Token Club in New Albany, IN. There were 6 of 10 committee members present who presented their final reports and I will try to provide a brief summary.

Treasurer: We are submitting a check to the region for \$8,437.52 which includes the \$6000 seed money for the convention. Our net profit is \$2437.52.

Registration - We had a total of 309 registrations for the convention which includes the 50 newcomer packets that were given. We had many people take advantage of use of Pay Pal for registration (\$1527) at the convention and would definitely recommend the use of this again in the future. The left over registration items have been given to the KRCNA 30 merchandise chair to use during fundraisers.

Hotel & Hospitality - We did meet our room block although a final accounting of the total number of registered rooms is not available. We have placed the banners in storage locally as OVANA will be utilizing the banners next year and felt that this would save on the wear and tear to the banners. If this is not okay, please advise as to who is willing to pick up the banners and return them to storage in Owensboro.

Merchandise - Total merchandise sales = \$5014 of which \$1261 was with the use of Pay Pal which allowed for credit card transactions. The merchandise chair felt that use of Pay Pal definitely improved overall sales. We are also asking permission from the Region to continue to sale the left over merchandise and any income generated will be returned to the region.

The convention committee discussed ideas that we felt could save the region money and generate a higher attendance at this event. We will be presenting these in motion form for review and vote by the Region.

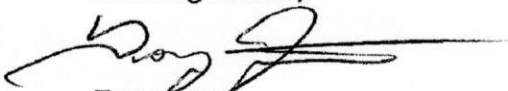
KRSCNA TREASURER'S REPORT

July 19, 2015

Hello Family,

It's good to be back at Rebos in Evansville! The beginning balance for the Kentuckiana Region before the May meeting was \$15,670.72. We paid our rent to the Bardstown Road Presbyterian Church of \$25 with check #1096. We paid for Frank H. to get to the meeting with Check #1097 in the amount of \$35 and Mikey P. to do the same with Check #1098 for \$54.06. We had to pay a couple of bills: Check #1099 was written to the US Postal Service for our PO Box in the amount of \$62 and the archives in Owensboro were taken care of with Check #1100 totaling \$468 to AAA Rent-A-Space. Check #1101 was written to KRCNA XXX in the amount of \$5750 to disperse the rest of the seed money. Check # 1102 was written for our donation to NAWs for 40% of the profit from the convention in the amount of \$1,062.61. I have to apologize to this body for my procrastination in sending said check to California. It is in the mail now, but will not be evident on the bank statements I will be providing today. The balance at the end of the meeting was \$8,214.05. During the meeting the KRCNA XXIX committee turned in a check in the amount of \$8,437.52 to return the \$6,000 seed money and an impressive profit of \$2,437.52. That wasn't enough, for the efforts of the merchandise committee wasn't satisfied so they turned in \$219 in cash and checks bringing my deposit on 5/20/2015 to a total of \$8,656.52. I have received a donation from the Owensboro Area of \$25 and several donations from the Louisville Area in the mail. I deposited a \$100 donation on 7/1/2015. I also received the Louisville Area's quarterly donation of \$1000 and another check of \$100 and they were deposited on 7/17/2015. I received Vera H.'s payment of \$300 by money order on 7/17/2015 but I haven't deposited it yet. I had informed her that \$600 was required to get her current, but it didn't happen. This leaves us with a balance at the beginning of this meeting of \$18,395.57. We appreciate all of the support! I'm including in my report the reconciliation, bank statements, receipts, deposit slips and Vera H.'s payment schedule. Thank you for allowing me to serve.

Group Conscience & NA Literature

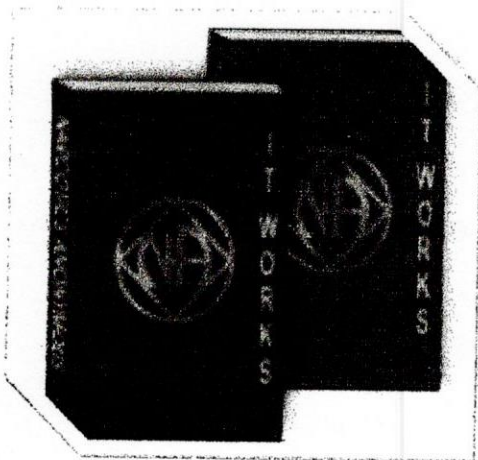

In 1991 the World Service Conference passed two motions—one to reaffirm that the WSO holds ownership of NA's intellectual property in trust for the Fellowship of NA, and another to reaffirm that the WSO is exclusive publisher and distributor of all NA literature.

At the time, WSO's intellectual property attorney explained to the Conference:

"This needs to be done for the benefit of those people who do not have the time, energy, or the interest to look back at what really happened and would rather argue that the past consists of what they believe should have happened."

And here we are again—increasing numbers of our members are illegally copying and distributing NA literature around the world, sowing seeds of confusion and disunity, including places where NA is in early stages. In particular, people are publishing a booklet that contains the Third Edition Revised Basic Text with the Second Edition versions of the Fourth and Ninth Traditions, a booklet that was compiled by a few individuals and has **never been Fellowship-approved**. It is bad enough that we have had this ongoing struggle within NA; now it has become a public problem because these texts are being distributed in institutions.



The roots of this conflict go back more than 30 years. The history of the Basic Text is a story that gets told many ways, with different heroes and villains depending on who is doing the telling.

There are some things, however, that are not open to interpretation:

- 1. It goes against group conscience.** The fellowship has decided on these issues repeatedly,
 - ❖ beginning in 1984 when the fellowship voted to return to the First Edition language for the Fourth and Ninth Traditions,
 - ❖ and again in 1988 when the conference rejected the idea of extensive changes to the text beyond fixing the errors in the Fourth Editions,
 - ❖ and again in 1991 when the conference voted against reconsidering which edition of the book should be published,
 - ❖ and again in 1993 when the fellowship approved the *Fellowship Intellectual Property Trust*,
 - ❖ and again as recently as 2004 when a CAR motion was passed authorizing revisions to the Basic Text but specifying no changes be made to chapters one through ten of the text. That 2004 motion resulted in the Sixth Edition Basic Text, which was approved **unanimously** in 2008.
- 2. It's illegal.** The unauthorized reproduction of NA literature is a violation of copyright law. NA groups can copy and distribute NA literature for use within their groups, but that right does not extend outside the group or to individuals and service bodies.

3. It doesn't make sense. On top of everything else, the portions of the Fourth and Ninth Traditions reinserted into the text of the booklets that are being distributed don't reflect most members' understanding of NA service. The Fourth Tradition essay says of service committees, offices, and activities, **"these things are not N.A."** The Ninth Tradition essay says that service boards or committees **"are not a part of Narcotics Anonymous."** That doesn't even make sense, does it? Are the funds from your area dance an outside donation? Is your local H&I committee somehow not a part of NA?

We are writing this on behalf of NA World Services, and we consider ourselves a grateful part of NA. NAWS provides support and services to addicts, meetings, and service bodies in 132 countries, speaking 77 languages. We interact with professionals and officials who influence the lives of addicts around the world to make our message more available. Here are just a few figures to give you a sense of our work. In the 2013–2104 fiscal year, we

- ❖ gave away and discounted \$460,000 worth of literature;
- ❖ answered more than 5,800 inmate inquiries with an information packet and NA literature;
- ❖ sent out more than 450 group starter kits and more than 45 institutional group starter kits;
- ❖ held quarterly PR web meetings with 206 area and regional trusted servants from seven countries on four continents, and H&I web meetings with 149 trusted servants from 13 countries on four continents;
- ❖ published 54 new pieces of translated literature, bringing us to 900 translated titles for NA recovery literature; and
- ❖ participated in 32 fellowship development and zonal events.

The money to pay for those services comes mostly from literature sales. In essence, when you buy a Basic Text, you are helping to pay for the literature we give away around the world and all of our other efforts.

Despite that fact, some people will tell you that the Basic Text is too expensive and that is why they are illegally distributing an unapproved version. But again, the fellowship's conscience is clear: The motion to produce a lower-cost Basic Text has been before the conference at least nine times; it's been committed once, ruled out of order twice, and defeated at least six times.

In the end, this isn't about politics or personal views; this is about the spiritual principles of group conscience and NA unity. Please respect the will of the fellowship.
